The Kennedy Boys Volleyball Team followed up their 2012 New York State Championship with a second place New York State finish and a second consecutive Long Island Championship in 2013. The team dominated Nassau County opponents going a perfect 19-0 in matches and a perfect 57-0 in sets. With a difficult routine filled with stunts, tumbling, dancing and cheering, the girls were given every opportunity to bring out the best of their ability. After 5 years of long and hard work, finally Bellmore-JFK took a trophy home from a LICCA competition. Being a part of a team is about making memories that will last a lifetime and doing the very best you can, not about winning, but finally my team has something to show for all the blood, sweat and tears during practice. ## **HOW TO PLAN A REUNION**

## Form a Committee

Call local classmates to form a planning committee. For help the JFK Alumni Association can provide a list of local classmates, including addresses, phone numbers, and email addresses, where available.

If you are not successful in finding enough volunteers, place a notice on our JFK Alumni Facebook page, or send email to your classmates who have registered on Classmates.Com. Stress that if there are no volunteers there will be no reunion.

Even classmates who are not local can participate by helping to find missing classmates, working on souvenirs, putting together a reunion booklet, or helping with computer tasks.

### **Preliminary Steps**

Contact the Webmaster of the Alumni Association to post a similar announcement on the JFK Alumni web site. Hold a meeting of that committee to make basic decisions:

- The date(s) that would be acceptable.
- What would be included dinner/dance, cocktail party, brunch, something at JFK, gathering at someone's home, etc.
- An acceptable price range.
- Suggested locations for the activities. Then assign people to check on those places discussed as possibilities: their availability, the price, and what it includes, for example open bar vs cash bar, choices of food, cash advance, and deadlines. The preliminaries can be done over the phone.
- Get a mailing out to your classmates with at least the basic information of date and an idea of what will be planned. You may want to solicit suggestions to get them involved as well. You will need addresses of missing classmates, so include that list in the mailing. It's also nice to include a membership form for the Alumni Association. At some point you will probably want to open a checking account.
- At your next meeting decide what place(s) you will use, the exact date(s), and what price you will need to charge. Keep in mind your expenses for several mailings; printing a reunion program with list of classmates; decorations; cost of invited guest(s), such as your class advisor; music; etc. How often the committee meets depends on available time and need to discuss; the telephone can substitute for some needs, but the first two meetings pretty much have to be done as a group.

<u>Mailings</u> (you're best off with supplying us with all your email contact info and we will also email information from our database.)

The first mailing is your "early warning" to alert your classmates so they can make plans. If you do not have a specific date, at least give an idea such as "Spring 2015."

The second mailing will give specific information. By then you should know the exact date and cost, have suggestions on lodging, and you may want at this time to include a questionnaire or even ask for upfront money for the reunion. If you ask people to pay in advance be sure that you tell them a cut-off date by which time they can get a refund if they find that they cannot attend.

If you want a response to questions or money solicitation be sure to include an self-addressed envelope. You will have a very low response if you do not enclose an envelope.

The number of mailings will vary according to need and time available. The final mailing should include specific directions to the various activities, and may be to all classmates or only those indicating their attendance.

## Search for Classmates, an Ongoing Project

Assign one person to coordinate this project, although you may have many people working on it.

From your yearbook, graduation programs, etc. make a full list of all your classmates, including those who were in your class but may have not graduated. A computer will be helpful for keeping track of everything.

From the Alumni Association get the addresses available for your class.

Begin contacting people to find your missing classmates. It is much more efficient and inexpensive to make this contact by phone. A short phone call will quickly determine whether the contact can provide the address you want. You can make many short phone calls for the price of one postage stamp, and you get an immediate answer.

From our experience, most people do not respond to inquiries by mail!!! When making your calls be sure to start by identifying yourself as calling for the JFK class of XX, and say why you're calling.

Be sure to inform the Alumni Association of all addresses you find so we can keep our database up-to-date for you. This is important. Send all changes, including phone numbers and email addresses to Rsteiger@bellmorejfkalumni.org

Organize a great reunion easily (and inexpensively) by drawing on us for help. We can provide:

- guidance in finding your missing classmates utilizing our database for siblings.
- guide to organizing a reunion with sample letters. Pirate clipart too!
- publicity on our web site and publications.

These alumni, among many others, have donated their time and energy to providing our seniors with hands-on experiences in their respective fields. In turn, our students have learned much about their college and career goals, and have created networks that have become invaluable to them in their post-college years.

Recently, Andrew Bank, a member of the Class of 2007, wrote me the following testimonial about his Senior Experience internship, "The inaugural Senior Experience Program helped me develop professional relationships and skills which molded my academic interests and made me a stronger candidate for a variety of summer internships. It made me significantly more comfortable in collaborative environments and helped guide my course selections to reflect the specific sides of the industry that intrigued me most. Before taking part in the program, I had never worked in a corporate environment. The daily grind of commuting and working outside my comfort zone helped me evolve and mature. I learned how to assist executives and determine how/when to be assertive in a creative environment. The program helped condition me to work even harder, and I'm forever grateful for the accelerated professional growth it afforded me."

Established in 2006, the Senior Experience program runs three weeks. During that time seniors are excused from classes to participate in an internship or community service project. ## CAMPUS TO RECEIVE MAJOR IMPROVEMENTS

Kennedy High School opened in September 1966 to meet the needs of the ever growing population of students in the Bellmores and the Merricks. In order to build the new school, the Board of Education floated a BOND, which would allow them to borrow monies for construction, which would be paid back over a period of years. That was forty-eight years ago.

This year, realizing that all of the buildings in the district were aging (despite best efforts to maintain the facilities) the Board of Education and the Central Administration went out to the community, to ask for their support to begin a massive upgrading of not only buildings, but to enhance the educational initiatives as well.

With the support of the residents, the BOND passed and a multi-year plan was established. This will have a significant impact on both the physical structure and programs at Kennedy High School. Among the areas that will receive immediate attention at Kennedy will be the refurbishing of the gymnasium floor, an up-grade to security (including the installation of numerous additional cameras), and the installation of a synthetic turf field. These items are being completed first, as they do not require plumbing, heating or electrical, and need minimal approval from the State Education Department.

The next phase of the project will include the construction of new science labs, enhanced cost-saving lighting, the installation of a new heating/air-conditioning unit (HVAC), reconstruction of building bathrooms, and the renovation of the Home and Careers room, which will ultimately serve as the "home" to a district-wide culinary arts program.

These exciting multi-year projects will ensure that Kennedy students will continue to have the facilities they need (in a safe environment) to continue to shine and excel in all areas. Watch for future updates!

Dustin's vision and hope is to help others like himself, affected with blood disease, to ease their emotional and financial stresses so they are able to take their positive strengths toward healing themselves. PREVAIL has and will continue to help patients and their families navigate through the many months of difficult treatments in and outside of medical facilities and guide them around all the painful side effects with helpful advice. *We lived the journey and have so much to share*. Coupled with this, PREVAIL'S hope is to **educate and bring awareness** for the great need for donations of blood and platelets. *PREVAIL is committed to facilitate more bone marrow drives* to register more bone marrow donors to the national registry. Currently, more than 10,000 patients need transplants and over 70 percent rely on a perfect stranger to donate. Please help us increase the chances to potentially save lives. Our prayer is to help bring more victories to these battles on every level, spiritually, emotionally, and ultimately physically.

My name is Steve Wunderlich and I am a 1971 graduate of JFK and was part of the best wrestling team in Nassau County, helped the soccer team win many games, spent my college days at C.W. Post and owned my own business for 27 years. I continue to stay connected to our great high school as a member of our school's Alumni Association. After all the things I have been involved in over the years since graduating, I am now the Executive Director of PREVAIL and finally I've found my real passion with a purpose that is driving me to work harder with more personal satisfaction than ever before.

We are very proud of some of the work PREVAIL has been able to accomplish in the short time already. In March of 2010, we helped set a goal for transportation issues at the Stony Brook Cancer Center. We initiated their fleet of vehicles to transport patients to their needed outpatient treatments, who had limited means of getting there on their own. We started by facilitating the donation of a mini bus from We Transportation Inc. and recently in 2013, PREVAIL donated a car in the memory of PREVAIL'S founder, our dear son Dustin and his Grandfather Nat, my dad. Presently, Stony Brook Cancer Center has a weekly transportation schedule that enables many patients to receive their life saving outpatient treatments in a timely safe fashion.

To date, PREVAIL has helped bring in excess of three thousand donors added to the National Bone Marrow Registry. In particular, Stony Brook University in 2009, was our first drive done with Dustin and his buddy Alex, who were the poster boys. We had a successful three day drive that spanned the hospital side, university side as well as the cancer center. We added just under a thousand donors. Since then SBU, through much relentless prodding on my and PREVAIL'S part had a second successful bone marrow donor drive in November 2012. That drive would be the last drive that Dustin hosted with his very "old soul" wise words that in one day produced a record 867 donors to the registry. Better yet, those donors to date matched five donors to patients in need that have received a lifesaving bone marrow transplant. In this way, Dustin still PREVAILS, he has potentially saved many lives with his efforts and mission, as it continues now through us.

PREVAIL continues Dustin's mission to reach the young minds and hearts of those just starting their journey in life, those young adults attending colleges and universities here on Long Island and beyond. Our goal is to accomplish and mirror what we have at Stony Brook University, to have an annual bone marrow drive that will educate and build the registry with wonderful young people signing on. The growth of this potential lifesaving list of kind souls who will donate a small part of themselves is imperative to saving many more lives in the future.


## Kennedys First Annual Health Fair

## JFK – Then and Now

If you drive by JFK from any direction, other than the new digital sign, things look pretty much the same as when the school opened in 1966. Now that's all about to change, with the turf athletic field, major facility upgrades and alumni driven grounds beautification projects taking hold. Which got me thinking about how much, despite the seemingly unchanged exterior, the school has changed over the years, and how much it remains very much the same.

- Academics. JFK has been and remains an academic powerhouse with the vast majority of its students being college bound. Over the years, advanced placement course offerings have expanded in subject matter and the grades in which they may be taken. JFK had three Intel Semi-Finalists in 2014 out of 300 nationwide, and has had a total of 34 Semi-Finalists in the past 10 years. Academic diversity and alternative programs have also flourished. Unlike 1966, JFK now has a nine-member Special Education Department and BOCES rents space from JFK in which special needs students learn the food service business and run the Kennedy Café. After the renovations, JFK will have state-of-the art kitchen facilities and will be home to the district-wide culinary arts program. Trending ... Assistant Principal Eileen Connolly advises that applications to two year colleges are up with students planning to move on to four-year programs when they graduate.
- Athletics. I'd be inclined not to say "powerhouse" here, but I'd be wrong. This Newsletter issue highlights the success of four of JFK's many sports teams our perennially winning wrestlers, State champion boys' volleyball players, girls' track and field and the varsity cheerleading team. Padded chairs supplied by the resurgent Sports Boosters have made it comfortable to watch indoor events. Then and now ... Do you remember working out on the old universal behind the boys' gym? It's gone. Instead, the old rifle range has been converted to a full-service physical fitness center open to all students and used by boys' and girls' sports teams. Rifle range? ... The rifle squad is now district-wide and if I saw last year's yearbook picture right, it has equal numbers of boys and girls.
- Activities. I thought there could not have been all that much going on when JFK opened in 1966, but the '67 yearbook lists 20 clubs ranging from *The Cougar Crier* to drama to Future Nurses of America, Ski Club and the AV squad. AV squad? The mainstays have endured, but here are some clubs you would not have seen in 1966: Gay Straight Alliance, promoting a respectful, tolerant and safe environment for students of all backgrounds; Culture Club, celebrating students' cultural differences; H.O.P.E. (Helping Our Planet Earth), promoting environmental awareness and recycling; S.A.D.D. (Students Against Destructive Decisions); and Athletes Helping Athletes, promoting sports and avoiding destructive decisions related to alcohol and drugs.
- Women in Charge. JFK had a Principal and one Assistant Principal in 1966, both men. The Central High School District school board had one female member of nine pictured in the yearbook (plus a female clerk). Now the Principal and one of three assistant principals are women. And six of the eight members of the school board are women. But some things haven't changed ... the office staff, all women; the cafeteria staff, all women but I hope the terms lunch lady and office lady have gone the way of stewardess.
- Size Matters. The size of the JFK student body has varied tremendously over the years. In '78, during class changes, I remember the hallways being packed from side to side and end to end; now, I've been in the building when the bell rings, and it seems like little is happening except some kids walking around. When the school opened, it had 980 students in two grades. The population rose to over 2,200 in three grades in the late 1970's, then fell to a low of 830 students in four grades in 1996. The school now has an enrollment of approximately 1,200 in grades 9-12.
- Smoking. Well we had to have some fun sometime. Do you remember the back hallway, the unofficially tolerated area for smoking tobacco and other substances? Do you remember smoke billowing from the second floor faculty lounge when the bell rang? No more. As mandated by law, the school and grounds have a zero-tolerance smoke-free policy.

Some more changes – the simulators are gone from the driver education classrooms; the metal, wood and automotive shops are gone, but we have advanced art, computer assisted design and pre-engineering programs; so far as I can tell, the doors have been reinstalled on the boys' bathroom stalls; and I could go on and on, and will in future issues. As alumni, I think we can, overall, be proud of the things about JFK that have remained constant over the years, and proud of the ways it has changed and continues to keep pace with the times. 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
